

Franklin FAQ (Answers provided by Supt. Marty Brewer)

6th Grade/Stevens

Q: Why not log the property at Stevens?

A: We are looking into that at this time.

Ball Fields at Monroe

Q: I really like the Monroe field idea. Would restrooms be available on site?

A: When the entire complex is developed, yes, there will be bathrooms on site.

Parents/Community/Voting

Q: How will you engage the community before asking for new bond/levy money?

A: Our next attempt to pass a Capital Projects Levy or bond will look quite different from previous campaigns. We will use community groups, including Chamber, the county, the city, Olympic Medical Center, and so on. We want to encourage folks to contribute meaningful conversations around the needs in our community.

Other Ideas

Q: Why do we need the 5th largest facility in the state? Projected numbers of students for years to come?

A: Ours would not be the fifth largest in the state. We are looking at 825 – 875 middle school students (including sixth grade). Projected growth was included to plan a model capable of accommodating middle school grades six through eight. Our plan has a total of 109,545 sq. ft. and the state formula allocates 97,200 sq. ft. for up to 900 middle school students.

Q: How are we going to effectively meet the community needs with only 2 preschools?

A: We are adding a third preschool at Roosevelt beginning in the 2019 – 20 school year.

CSB to Lincoln

Q: It makes sense to use one building for administration. How/who does that impact in the building now? (the Lincoln Center)

A: It impacts the current occupants of the Lincoln Center, including the ESD, EDC, and Peninsula College. We will work with these organizations to determine space needs.

Community Partnerships

Q: If we are focusing on healthy eating can we focus on healthy breakfast at school?

A: Yes.

Safety

Q: Start safety doors in schools ASAP. Not in the 6-year plan, that's not student safety first.

A: Agreed---this is a priority.

Franklin

Q: Where will Franklin students go during construction?

A: They will stay in their existing building during construction of the new Franklin.

Q: Will OT/PT/other specialists have an office space on the 1st level to abide by ADA?

A: Any 21st century building must be ADA compliant, so, yes.
