Education Foundation Acknowledges Recent Donations

The Port Angeles Education Foundation would like to acknowledge several recent donations to its Student Needs Fund, which provides monies for clothing, school supplies, physical education uniforms, class fees, bus passes, medical/dental services and counseling to low income students in the Port Angeles School District. To date, during the 2009-2010 school year, nearly 200 students have received assistance from this program.



Mr. and Mrs. Robert Worley made three generous donations totaling \$3,000 to this year's Student Needs Program. The Worley's are long-time Port Angeles residents and strong supporters of this program. The Albert Haller Foundation provided grants totaling \$17,700 for the Student Needs Program. Additionally, the Benjamin N. Phillips Memorial Fund gave \$5,000 to support the program. These gifts will help alleviate the current heavy level of requests received by the Student Needs Fund.

"We would also like to recognize the generosity of Dr. Thomas McCurdy and Dr. Sayge Wisecup of the Olympic Eye Care Center," Board member Tricia Barrett said. "They currently provide free eye examinations to students who lack insurance, and have already provided service to 42 students. Additionally, they have helped raise funds for our Foundation." Other contributions from local businesses include Strait Occupational and Hand Therapy who gave \$231 for backpacks, and First Federal who donated \$500 for the Student Needs Program.
