The Levy: What Can I Do?

Some staff members have asked “What can I do?”

Here are some pointers:

- **OK** to provide factual levy information to parents and other community members.
- **OK** to remind people to vote by February 6, 2007.
- **OK** to wear one “button” on district property indicating your vote of choice.
- **OK** to have signs & bumper stickers in your cars on district property.
- **OK** to wave signs on your own time, and to have levy signs in your own yard.
- **OK** to indicate your levy voting preference off district property on your own time.
- **No** use of school district resources to campaign for the levy.

- **No** “vote yes” messages to parents or others From school computers.
- **No** use of school time to encourage people to vote for the levy.
- **No** student use of school resources to make levy posters that advocate passage of the levy.
