SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

UFCW (United Food & Commercial Workers) offers 15 scholarships in Western Washington to students who are members of this union or are children of members. The awards range from \$1000 to part time students to \$4000 a year for four years. If you work at Albertsons, Safeway or OMC you may qualify. Applications **due Feb. 15**.

Best Buy Scholarships: Best Buy is offering twelve hundred \$1000 scholarships nationally to students who are involved in community volunteer programs with a gpa of 2.5 or above. It is all online and due **Feb. 15**. Go to www.bestbuy-communityrelations.com

ASCE Thomson Memorial Scholarship is for a student planning a career as a Civil Engineer. It is one scholarship for \$5000 that can be renewable through grad school. Applications due **February 15**.

Soroptimists Noon Club is opening their scholarship again until February 17. If you have a 3.3 gpa or greater and have not already applied for this scholarship, we do have applications in Guidance again. They can be returned to Mrs. Eykemans by **February 17 or mailed to the address on the form**.

Pemco/ Washington State School Retiree's Association: Twenty-six scholarships are offered statewide to students planning a career in education. Some of them are renewable for four years. Go to www.wssra.org **Due March 1**.

The Pollanz Scholarship is worth \$8000 a year for four years and is winnable. Applicants should be planning a career in science, engineering, business or education, have financial need and be attending a 4-year college in the fall. Essay required. **Due March 2**.

Pemco/WASA 21st Century Educator Scholarship: Three \$4000 scholarships in Washington to future teachers. One is for a minority student. Applications **due March 5th.**

The Kelly Scholarship is for \$2500 to students who demonstrate good citizenship and achieve high academic goals. Financial need is also considered. Out of 700 applications last year, 52 scholarships were awarded. **Due March 12.**

The PA Football Club Reath Ellefson Scholarship: If you played football at PAHS all four years, you can apply for this scholarship. **The application is due to Mrs. Eykemans by March 15th.**

International Footprint Assoc. Scholarship: \$1000 going to a student planning a career in law enforcement or firefighting. You must have turned in a Scholarship Notebook. **Applications due March 16.**

Leadership 1000 Scholarship: \$2500 to \$5000. Applicants need to be attending a 4-year college in the State of Washington. Financial need must exist and verified by a filed FAFSA form. There are income guidelines listed with the application. Students need to have a minimum 2.75 g.p.a. **Due March 23.** Go to: collegesuccessfoundation.org

The Scott Scholarship is for \$2500 to a student with a 3.0 or better who will be attending a 4-year university in the fall of 2011. Parent's combined income may not exceed \$100,000 a year. Applicants should have demonstrated leadership in school and community activities and be a US citizen. Last year 11 scholarships were awarded nationally. Applications **due March 31.**

ESA Youth Scholarship: Total of five scholarships, ranging from \$1000 to \$10,000, to students who are children of active law enforcement or fire department. Essay, SAT or ACT scores required. Applications **due March 31.**

Sons of Norway: \$500 to a student who is a member of the Sons of Norway, related to a member, or sponsored by a member. Applicant may plan to attend a college, university or trade school. **Due April 15.**

PA Youth Baseball: If you played Cal Ripken, Junior Babe Ruth or high school baseball or umpired for OJBR or PA Youth Baseball, you may be eligible for this scholarship. It requires an essay and is **due to Mrs. Eykemans by Apr 21st.**

Olympic Junior Babe Ruth Scholarship: If you played all three years of OJBRS and turned in a scholarship notebook, you can apply for this scholarship. It requires a 100 word essay and is **due to Mrs. Eykemans by April 21st.**

The Hair School Scholarship: They offer a \$5000 scholarship to any student who would like to attend The Hair School upon high school graduation for the COSMETOLOGY course. They will also offer a \$3000 scholarship to any student who would like to attend The Hair School for the MANICURING course, \$2000 for the ESTHETICIAN course and \$4000 for the BARBERING course @ www.thehairschool.gmail.com
