<u>PAEF Grant Application</u> <u>Due Oct. 7th!</u>

During the 2020-21 school year, PAEF is funding 17 projects totaling nearly \$37,000 throughout the district, ranging from 11th-grade personal finance to musical instruments for middle school and elementary students.

While COVID-19 precautions prevent field trips this year, there were multiple requests for book collections and clubs, gardens, and outdoor space enhancements.



In the past, teachers were issued vouchers from the Port Angeles Friends of the Library (PAFOL) to "buy" books for their classroom libraries before the start of the school year. Due to COVID, PAFOL is unable to offer that program this year.

However, PAFOL has received a big donation of 2,500 children's books for elementary and middle school students and is selling them for \$0.25 each or 5 for \$1.00. PAFOL invites all teachers and parents to come and purchase these books. They are on a special rack in the lobby of the Port Angeles branch of NOLS. They are being sold through the PAFOL bookstore.

The PAFOL bookstore opens at 10am Monday through Saturday and closes at 5:30 Monday through Thursday, 4:45pm on Friday, and 3pm on Saturday.
