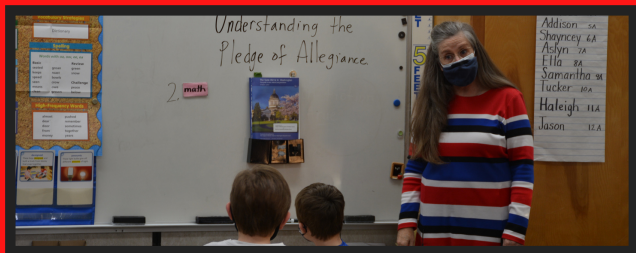

Jackie's three sons attend school in Neah Bay, and Serenity and Trinity go to Hamilton Elementary. Jackie's spouse, Jed, is a Police Officer for The Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe. Her family loves to spend time together doing fun things like cooking, hunting, riding e-bikes along the Olympic Discovery Trail, and paddleboarding on Lake Crescent. They have two bearded dragons named Tiger and Flash! In speaking with Jackie, you can tell her family is everything to her. One day she hopes to have a big farm to grow food and raise chickens, ducks, and goats. She dreams of living off the land.

Jackie shared that her family loves and misses traditional Makah dancing. Her family and friends used to gather during potlaches to celebrate weddings. During potlatch weddings, different families would have their own dances and do a love circle. A love circle is when everyone gathers together, sings, and gathers money in a handwoven cedar basket for the bride and groom. Sounds beautiful!

During the summer months, you can find Jackie and her family gathering fresh fruit and vegetables and fishing for salmon for canning! Her spouse Jed teaches the online hunter's safety course and takes her sons hunting for elk and deer. This last year, Kaedan tanned an elk hide, and the family made jerky, summer sausage, and pepperoni sticks. Yum! Jackie's family took quarantine as time slow down and try new things.
